Road Map of IDR on the PoWIB Draft amended 1 September 2011

Background

COP decision VIII/1 adopted the programme of work on island biodiversity (PoWIB). It aims to achieve the three main objectives of the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), and more specifically to reduce significantly the rate of island biodiversity loss by 2010 and beyond, as a contribution to poverty alleviation and the sustainable development of islands, particularly small island developing States (SIDS). The PoWIB sets out almost 50 priority actions addressing characteristics and problems that are specific to islands arranged under 11 goals. These are organized under the following seven focal areas:

- 1. Protect the components of biodiversity
- 2. Promote sustainable use
- 3. Address threats to biodiversity
- 4. Maintain goods and services from biodiversity to support human well-being
- 5. Protect traditional knowledge and practices
- 6. Ensure the fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising out of the use of genetic resources
- 7. Ensure provision of adequate resources

In decision IX/21 (see http://www.cbd.int/doc/decisions/cop-09/cop-09-dec-21-en.pdf), the Conference of the Parties to the CBD requested the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA) to undertake an in-depth review of the programme of work on island biodiversity at one of its meetings after the tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties (Nagoya, Japan, October 2010), for final consideration by COP 11 in 2012. The COP reiterated this decision at its tenth meeting, indicating that the eleventh meeting of the Conference of the Parties would take place in 2012 and address, *inter alia*, the in-depth review of the programme of work on island biodiversity (X/9). There will be two SBSTTAs (15 and 16) in between the two COPs. SBSTTA 15 is scheduled for 7-11 November 2011, and SBSTTA 16 for 7-11 May 2012, while COP 11 is scheduled for early November 2012the in-depth review is scheduled for SBSTTA 16.

The end result of the in-depth review (IRD) on the PoWIB will be based on a strong collaborative effort between the consultants and a team of IDR supporters (SCBD, GLISPA, IDR volunteers, island champions and groups that have been established to support this review). The first step is to establish a core team to guide the IDR process.

Objectives of Review

As per decision VIII/1 and additional guidance from previous in-depth reviews, the objectives of this in-depth review can be summarized as:

- Provide Parties with an overview of the global status and trends of island biodiversity;
- Demonstrate progress made on islands in achieving the goals and targets of the CBD 2011-2020 Strategic Plan, adopted at COP 10;
- Demonstrate how the island programme of work has assisted Parties and partners in implementing relevant island decisions and the Convention as a whole;
- Identify challenges and barriers to be overcome;

- Identify priorities for capacity-building to address the barriers in implementation;
- Review, update and/or expand the programme of work, as appropriate, based on lessons learned and experiences, proposing improvements for the deliberation of Parties at COP 11.

As such, the review should also ensure that the further implementation of the programme of work contributes to, and reflects, the 2011-2020 Strategic Plan on Biodiversity and other COP decisions related to island biodiversity (on protected areas, invasive alien species, climate change, development, etc).

Sources/Inputs

The in-depth review will receive input from the following sources:

Submissions by Parties, other Governments and partners, such as UN organizations, inter- governmental organizations, non-governmental organizations, regional organizations and programmes, scientific community, indigenous and local communities, in response to a notification sent in February 2011. The rate of response to such notifications is, however, typically very low, so other forms of research must be envisaged.

Analysis of fourth national reports submitted by island Parties and Parties with islands. Of some 40 small island States, just over half 20 had submitted their fourth national report as of 11 February 2011. Virtually all-13 non-SIDS island countries had submitted their report, and all eight countries with islands, or countries actively engaged in island issues, had submitted theirs.

Secondary sources (reports, publications by partners) on such subjects as status and trends of island biological diversity, island initiatives, and successes and challenges in dealing with the goals of the strategic plan. Many of these resources are available at:

The SBSTTA pre-session document could include the following sections, which may be adapted somewhat depending on the information available:

- 1. Status and trends in island biodiversity (secondary sources, see "Sources," above);
- 2. Review of the contribution the programme of work has made to the achievement of the Strategic Plan of the convention; (analysis of fourth national reports to the CBD and voluntary reports sent in response to the notification). The focus will be the reports of island countries (SIDS and non-SIDS) and countries with islands or

actively engaged in island issues;

The analysis will proceed by goal or target of the strategic plan, keeping in mind the following priority areas for assessment, as indicated in decision 9/21, para 6:

- o invasive alien species (targets 6.1, 6.2)
- o climate-change adaptation and mitigation activities (targets 7.1, 7.2)
- o marine protected areas (targets 1.1, 1.2)
- o capacity-building (targets 11.1, 11.2, 11.3)
- o access to, and fair and equitable sharing of the benefits arising out of the utilization of genetic resources (targets 9.2, 10.1,10.2)
- o poverty alleviation, as it relates to goods and services resulting from biodiversity (target 8.2);

The analysis will describe: i) progress in implementation; and ii) obstacles to implementation

- 3. Tools and approaches to assist implementation.
- 4. Outlook, needs and opportunities

The following plan of action aims to help achieve the objectives of the review.

To monitor, evaluate and if required modify the action plan, regular conference calls and email discussions will be held between the consultants, the SCBD, GLISPA, IDR core group and the IDR support group.
